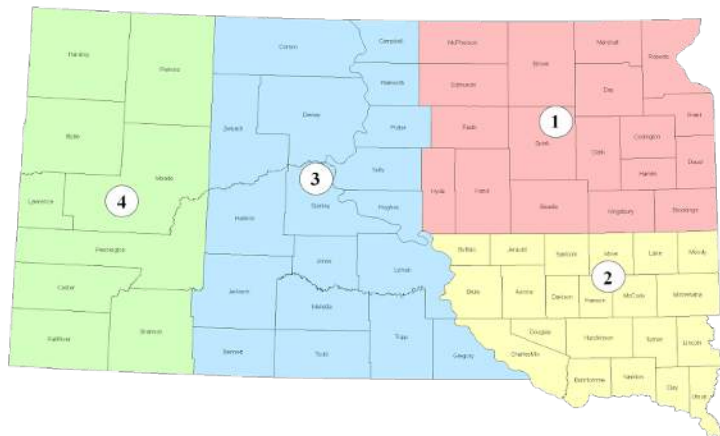

NOXIOUS OR OBNOXIOUS?

Many readers of this newsletters are in some form of agricultural production and are very familiar with statewide and local noxious weeds and pests. But many new readers deal with the other group of weeds - the obnoxious variety that show up in our lawns and gardens.

Beginning with this issue of the Weed Watcher newsletter, we will have a section that will deal with the obnoxious group of weeds and how to control them.

To address this area, we enlisted the help of Tom Hedrick, an Association Board member who is familiar with this particular area.

HERE ARE TOM'S TURF TIPS FOR THIS ISSUE:

As we move into fall, now is a good time to evaluate your weed control in turf this past season.



Most of the crabgrass that escaped has now set seed for next year. Plan your 2018 pre-emergent treatments with Dimension, Barricade, or Pendulum.



Now is a good time to treat dandelions and other small-seeded broadleaf weeds in turf. Vessel or other 3-way products will do a good job.



"Obnoxious" weeds are the variety that show up in our lawns and gardens, such as field bindweed.

For perennial weeds like Wild Violet, field bindweed, clovers, and knotweed, delay post emerge applications until first frost, or shortly after. That is not too late to use translocated products containing Triclopyr (T Zone) as weeds move energy supplies below ground for overwintering. ∞

HURON 5TH GRADE STUDENTS EXPERIENCE AGRICULTURE

Our Association, along with 19 other organizations and businesses ranging from the Department Agriculture to Walmart, sponsored an agriculture experience for Huron's Washington 4-5 Center. Three busloads of students visited and spent an hour at each of 3 sites: an area dairy farm (Lazy J Dairy), a sheep operation (Jungemann Sheep Farm), and a South Dakota Wheat Growers grain terminal near Wolsey.

The story was covered by the Huron Daily Plainsman, in which they wrote that many of the children had never seen a farm. This brief encounter should give the children at least a basic understanding that milk doesn't come from a carton, clothes start from somewhere other than on a hanger in a store, and bread starts in the field and not a plastic bag. The operators also talked about the importance of taking care of the land. ∞
